SUCCESS STORY

Jordan Lay, a single mom, wanted to broaden her education. Residing in Ozark, Illinois, she worked as a Certified Nursing Assistant for five years but was burnt out from working 3-4 days of 12-hour shifts at Union County Hospital. Jordan wanted to do more in the medical field. Due to personal reasons and the pandemic, she felt that an LPN/RN was not a good fit for her. Jordan was approved for the WIOA Program to pursue a certificate in the Certified Medical Assistant Program (CMA) in Fall 2021 at Shawnee Community College. Because of WIOA, she now has her dream job and can focus on supporting her family.

While the journey was never easy, Jordan achieved her goals. A month before graduating from the CMA program Jordan secured a job at Shawnee Health Services. Jordan says, "Working for Shawnee Health Services has given me a lot of hands-on experience with not just family medicine, but also suboxone therapy, pediatrics, and even gynecology work. I work alongside many other CMAs, LPNs, and even RNs. I'm giving shots, sending in medications, assisting with house procedures, and so much more. I now work Monday-Friday, 8 am-5 pm, and I'm blessed to be able to take and pick up my son from school every day instead of relying on others to do it for me. Being able to come home and have dinner with him every night and getting to plan fun and exciting weekends together is something I have always dreamed of. Becoming a CMA has been one of my best decisions for my son and myself."

Jordan says, "The SDC WIOA Program gave me peace of mind financially while in the CMA program. As a single mom attending school and working full-time, that was a huge relief. I didn't have to worry about if I needed to make a tuition payment or buy groceries or if buying my books meant I would have to borrow money from my parents. Aside from the financial part of the WIOA program giving me confidence. Sandy, was there any time I had a question or concern throughout the year. The WIOA program was one of the many learning posts during my time in the Certified Medical Assistant program. It's a hidden gem that needs more awareness." Jordan also wanted to extend her appreciation to the SDC WIOA Program by saying, "Thank you."

SDC has also hired a new Work Experience/Billing Coordinator. Her name is Caitlyn McGill who started on April 10th and is doing very well.

Southern Illinois Highlights

Carbondale – Marion Area

The February 2023 unemployment rate was 4.5 percent. This was a decrease of -0.2 percentage point from the February 2022 rate of 4.7 percent. Total nonfarm employment in February 2023 increased by +1,300 jobs compared to February a year ago. Government payrolls increased over-the-year (+100).

Surrounding Counties

Total nonfarm payrolls increased by +50 jobs in February 2023 compared to a year ago.

Employment gains were posted in Government (+200), Construction (+150), Educational and Health Services (+25), Information (+25), Manufacturing (+25) and Natural Resources and Mining (+25).

February payrolls declined in Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-275), Leisure and Hospitality (-75), Professional and Business Services (-25), Financial Activities (-25) and Other Services (-25).

Harrisburg Area

Total nonfarm employment increased by +850 jobs in February 2023 compared to February 2022.

Employment gains were posted in Government (+325), Educational and Health Services (+250), Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+100), Construction (+50), Information (+50), Manufacturing (+50), Natural Resources and Mining (+50) and Other Services (+25).

Employment declined over-the-year in Professional and Business Services (-50) and Leisure and Hospitality (-50).

Financial Activities payrolls were unchanged in February 2023.

Olney – Mt. Carmel Area

Total nonfarm employment increased by +400 jobs in February 2023 compared to February 2022.

Payrolls increased in Government (+300), Educational and Health Services (+100), Information (+25), Other Services (+25), Financial Activities (+25) and Construction (+25).

Payrolls decreased in Trade, Transportation and Utilities (-50).

No changes were reported in Manufacturing, Professional and Business Services, Natural Resources and Mining, or Leisure and Hospitality.
