WADI MONTHLY UPDATE

This month has been very busy! Bonnie has gone through the testing and application process with seven new students. Bonnie also has five continuing students that have come in to pick up vouchers and update their Individual Employment Plans (IEP). Nelda has been busy adding new participants for the fall semester too. She also has several meetings planned within the next few weeks for perspective worksites for Work Experiences. WADI is constantly adapting their program to fix flaws and make it run smoothly. Ryan D. has been working diligently on his files in preparation for the upcoming Technical Assistance from the state. The Fall Semester is now underway and WADI is now focusing on the potential CDL candidates on their waiting list as well. The CDL classes are staggered throughout the semester so applications and certificiations must be completed accordingly.

SDC MONTHLY UPDATE

SDC WIOA has enrolled 17 new participants for Fall 2023, which includes those in truck driving, nursing, basic electrical, business management, as well as other programs of study. SDC has also hired a total of 5 participants on the 1E Adult Work Experience program. Currently there is one in Hardin, Pulaski, and Union Counties. One additional Work Experience is expected to begin soon in Massac County. On July 26th the WIOA Program manager attended a CEJA Networking Fair at the Carbondale Civic Center. SDC has been monitored and provided in-service training this month by SO14. SDC program has also hired a new Work Coordinator/Billing Clerk who started on August 14th.

SOUTHERN 14 UPDATES

Jessica has been diligently working in the new Local Workforce Area Contact System (LWACS) to update and ensure our board is certified. As defined by WIOA policy, the board must be recertified every two years. This requires that all member information be completed in LWACS, all nomination and appointment/reappointment forms be signed and uploaded, composition summary form attested, signed, and uploaded, a copy of the local CEO Agreement by all 14 counties uploaded, our LWIB By-Laws uploaded, a business member narrative uploaded, and our statement of accessibility uploaded. She hopes to have this done before our next board meeting to be ahead of the October 1st deadline.

Pam has begun completing her 14 county board yearly meetings. All are scheduled with 5 complete. During her meetings Pam informs each county board about WIOA and the services it provides while showing what WIOA has been able to accomplish in that specific county over the last year.

Southern Illinois Highlights

Carbondale - Marion Area

The June 2023 unemployment rate was 4.8 percent. This was a +0.4 percentage point increase from the June 2022 rate of 4.4 percent. Total nonfarm employment increased by +500 jobs in June 2023 compared to June a year ago. Government payrolls increased over-the-year (+100).

Surrounding Counties

Total nonfarm payrolls increased by +150 jobs in June 2023 compared to a year ago.

Employment gains were posted in Construction (+100), Leisure and Hospitality (+75), Manufacturing (+75), Educational and Health Services (+75), Government (+50), Financial Activities (+25), and Natural Resources and Mining (+25).

No change was reported in Other Services or Information.

June payrolls posted declines in Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-200), and Professional and Business Services (-50).

Harrisburg Area

Total nonfarm employment increased by +625 jobs in June 2023 compared to June 2022.

Employment gains were posted in Government (+275), Educational and Health Services (+100), Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+100), Information (+75), Natural Resources and Mining (+50), Other Services (+50), Construction (+25), Manufacturing (+25), and Financial Activities (+25).

Leisure and Hospitality payrolls were unchanged in June 2023.

Employment declined over-the-year in Professional and Business Services (-50).

Olney – Mt. Carmel Area

Total nonfarm employment increased by +400 jobs in June 2023 compared to June 2022.

Payrolls increased in Government (+225), Educational and Health Services (+50), Other Services (+50), Leisure and Hospitality (+50), Construction (+25), Trade, Transportation and Utilities (+25), and Information (+25).

Professional and Business Services, Financial Activities, Manufacturing, and Natural Resources and Mining payrolls were unchanged.
