Southern Illinois Highlights

Carbondale – Marion Area

The January 2023 unemployment rate was 4.3 percent. This was a decrease of -1.1 percentage points from the January 2022 rate of 5.4 percent. Total nonfarm employment in January 2023 increased by +1,700 jobs compared to January a year ago. Government payrolls increased over-the-year (+100).

Surrounding Counties

Total nonfarm payrolls were unchanged in January 2023 compared to a year ago.

Employment gains were posted in Government (+150), Construction (+125), Manufacturing (+50), and Professional and Business Services (+25).

January payrolls declined in Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-275), Leisure and Hospitality (-50) Financial Activities (-25), and Educational and Health Services (-25).

Natural Resources and Mining, Other Services, and Information payrolls were unchanged over the year.

Harrisburg Area

Total nonfarm employment increased by +925 jobs in January 2023 compared to January 2022.

Employment gains were posted in Government (+350), Educational and Health Services (+225), Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+150), Construction (+75), Information (+50), Financial Activities (+50), Manufacturing (+50), and Natural Resources and Mining (+25).


Employment declined over-the-year in Professional and Business Services (-50) and Leisure and Hospitality (-50). Other Services payrolls were unchanged in January 2023.

Olney – Mt. Carmel Area

Total nonfarm employment increased by +475 jobs in January 2023 compared to January 2022.

Employment gains were posted in Government (+250), Education and Health Services (+100), Other Services (+50), Natural Resources and Mining (+25), Leisure and Hospitality (+25), Construction (+25), and Information (+25).

Payrolls decreased in Trade, Transportation and Utilities (-25). No changes were reported in Manufacturing, Financial Activities or Professional and Business Services.



-Shawnee Community College has contacted us concerning the Job Fair there on March 15th.


-Our WIOA staff has been attending the WIOA training webinars that have been offered and the future ones coming up next week.
