### **SOUTHERN 14 UPDATE**

The Office of Equal Opportunity Monitoring and Compliance (EOMC) has completed an Equal Opportunity (EO) compliance review for the Southern 14 Workforce Investment Board. The comprehensive review assists in providing assurance to the Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity (DCEO) and the United States Department of Labor (USDOL) that accessibility, both programmatic and physical, comply with State and Federal laws and regulations. The compliance review provided reasonable assurance of compliance with Nondiscrimination and Equal Opportunity provisions of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act. The next compliance review will be performed in Fiscal Year 2026-2027. This visit is a large process that take coordination with all our service providers, locations, and staff. They all worked hard with our office to make sure we were in compliance before EOMC was onsite. We started this process July 1 and were able to have all board office monitoring, self assessments, required documents, and files uploaded and ready for review by October 1. As you can see, we passed with flying colors and want to thank each location for their patience and help!

Information about the labor market is presented below for each county in your region. There are four quadrants for each county's portion of the writeup, and documentation for the vital components is described here.


- Top payroll jobs data are estimates of the count of filled positions offered by employers in the area. Service-providing jobs are those with employers in industries that do not produce a physical good or product in their line of business. Goods-producing jobs are jobs with employers in the following industries:
  - Agriculture and natural resources
  - Mining and mining support
  - Residential, nonresidential, and civil construction
  - Durable and nondurable manufacturing
- Middle labor force data are estimates of the count of residents in an area who are either employed or unemployed. Employed residents are operating a business or nonprofit or are working for pay. Unemployed residents are not employed but have actively searched for work during the previous four weeks. The totals exclude children under the age of 16, retirees, and other persons who are neither working nor seeking paid work
- Bottom wages paid (\$ in millions) by employers in the area to workers who are covered by the state's unemployment insurance system. These data are from quarterly reports issued to IDES by employers. These data include payments to workers who do not reside in the area, and exclude payments for labor provided under agreements that do not constitute an employer-employee relationship





